

# Are Catholics Required To Believe in Private Revelations?

No. Even for those apparitions and messages which are approved by the Church, it is not necessary for Catholics to believe anything new that was said, or even that the apparitions actually happened.

A number of apparitions (including Guadalupe in 1531, LaSalette in 1846, Lourdes in 1858, Fatima in 1917, Cracow [Divine Mercy] in 1931) have been approved by the Church. However, even when apparitions have been officially approved by the Church, they are still considered "private revelation." In other words, they aren't a necessary component of the Catholic faith.

This reserved, cautious approach by the Church is founded on the belief, and the fact, that God was absolutely and perfectly revealed to the apostles by Jesus, and that this revelation contains what we need for salvation. There can be no addition to the revelation given by Jesus. The words and example of the Lord provided everything.

Public revelation was completed through Jesus. It is found in sacred Scripture and the Tradition of the Church (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #65-66, 78). These form the deposit of faith, the sum of truths necessary for our salvation.

On May 13, 1982, at Fatima, Pope John Paul II said, "The Church has always taught and continues to proclaim that God's Revelation was brought to completion in Jesus Christ, who is the fullness of that Revelation, and that 'no new Revelation is to be expected before the glorious manifestation of our Lord'" (Vatican II, *Dei Verbum*, #4).

The Gospel/the scriptures, the Mass and sacraments and the official teachings of the Church are all that we need. Apart from them, no one is obliged to accept or follow anything in private revelation.

When the Church approves particular apparitions, all it says is that there is nothing contrary in them to Catholic faith or morals, and that following the suggestions in these messages may be helpful in our efforts toward holiness. If it enhances one's spiritual life and one's love of God and neighbor, that is good.

Pope Benedict XIV warned that even private revelations given to a canonized saint are subject to errors. The messenger could have heard something incorrectly, or forgotten to record something. St. Catherine Laboure, who originated the "miraculous medal" from one of her visions, when confronted with the error of certain of her predictions, pointed out that she got some facts of the revelation wrong.

# St. Peter Canisius 1521-1597 Catholic Reformer


St. Peter Canisius was the eighth Jesuit to make his solemn profession of vows. He played a vital role in the renewal and reformation of the Catholic Church in Central Europe. He believed that the Church's best response to the Protestant Reformation was to cleanse its own house and present the faith in a clear and attractive form.



He wrote unprecedented letters of criticism to leaders of the Church (always in the context of a loving, sympathetic concern), complaining that an honest explanation of the faith would be much more effective than personal attacks against Catholics who became "protestant" reformers. He rejected attacks against these "protestants" with the words: "With words like these, we don't cure patients, we make them incurable."

He taught in several universities, established colleges and seminaries, and wrote a catechism, a fantastically successful work that went through two hundred editions and was translated into fifteen languages during his lifetime. The catechism explained the Catholic faith in a way which ordinary people could understand, a great need of that age.

Another great contribution of Canisius was in his role as the first patron of Catholic publishing. While the excommunicated priest, Martin Luther, in his efforts to reform the Church, understood the potential power and significance of the printed media, the reformers within the Church were slower to seize on this technological revolution. (The printing press was invented around 1440.) Peter Canisius himself wrote many books, both for scholars and for a general audience, and in every city where he worked he was active in obtaining Church support for Catholic printers and publishers. This contribution was especially emphasized by Pope Pius XI when in 1925 Canisius was canonized and named a Doctor of the Church.

Pope Benedict XVI said that St. Peter Canisius insisted that there was a difference between willfully turning away from the faith and the loss of faith that was not a person's fault under the circumstances, and that Canisius declared to Rome that the majority of German Catholics who passed to the breakaway movement of Protestantism were without fault.



## St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross

(Edith Stein) 1891-1942

**Carmelite Martyr, Doctor of the Church** 

Edith Stein was born into an Orthodox Jewish family in Breslau, Germany, though by the time she was a teenager she had rejected her family's faith and declared herself an atheist. A brilliant scholar, she devoted herself to philosophy and completed her doctorate at the age of twenty-three. Increasingly, however, her studies prompted a growing interest in religion.

Visiting a young widow of a fellow philosopher, she expected to find her devastated. Instead, she found a calmness due entirely to the widow's deep

faith. On another occasion, she found an autobiography of St. Teresa of Avila at the home of friends. She avidly read it. The next day, she bought a catechism of the Catholic faith. After she attended Mass for the first time, she followed the priest and said that she wanted to become a Catholic. Nevertheless, because of respect for the feelings of her Jewish mother, she waited for twelve years before officially converting to Catholicism. She was baptized in 1922 at the Cologne Cathedral in Germany.

Edith taught for a while, translated the books of Catholic philosophers, and had a desire to enter the Carmelite Order of contemplative nuns. She entered the Carmelite monastery at Cologne in 1934, taking the religious name Teresa Benedicta of the Cross.

The persecution of Jews in Germany was rampant in 1938, and no distinction was made between Jews who had become Christian. Sister Teresa Benedicta had to leave Germany, and went to Holland. After the Nazi invasion of Holland in 1942, she was required to wear the Yellow Star of David on her religious habit. When the archbishop of Utrecht denounced the treatment of the Jewish people, the Nazis responded by deporting all Jews – including Christian converts – to concentration camps.

St. Teresa Benedicta died on August 9,1942 at the age of 51 in an Auschwitz gas chamber. In 1987, she was beatified in the Cologne Cathedral by Pope John Paul II and canonized on October 11, 1988.
